Brief History of the Chesapeake Station

During the Winter of 1945-46, several Cruising Club members joined together and formed the Philadelphia Station. These members felt that there was a need for such a Station to bring members scattered throughout the States of Pennsylvania, Maryland, New Jersey, Delaware, and Virginia and through this closer association stimulate Cruising Club activities in the Chesapeake Bay area.

The Philadelphia Station sponsored a fall rendezvous in the Chesapeake in October 1947 at which a total of 11 boats and 54 members and guests attended. The cruise started at Gibson Island and sailed to Oxford for dinner ashore at the Tred Avon Yacht Club. The success of this initial rendezvous caused the Station to resolve to make the Fall Rendezvous its biggest annual event.

In 1948, pursuant to the authority of the Board of Governors of the Cruising Club, the name of the Station was changed from the Philadelphia Station to the Chesapeake Station. Since that time, the Chesapeake Station has operated continuously with cruises and events each year and currently, with 145 members, is one of the largest CCA Stations after the Boston Station.

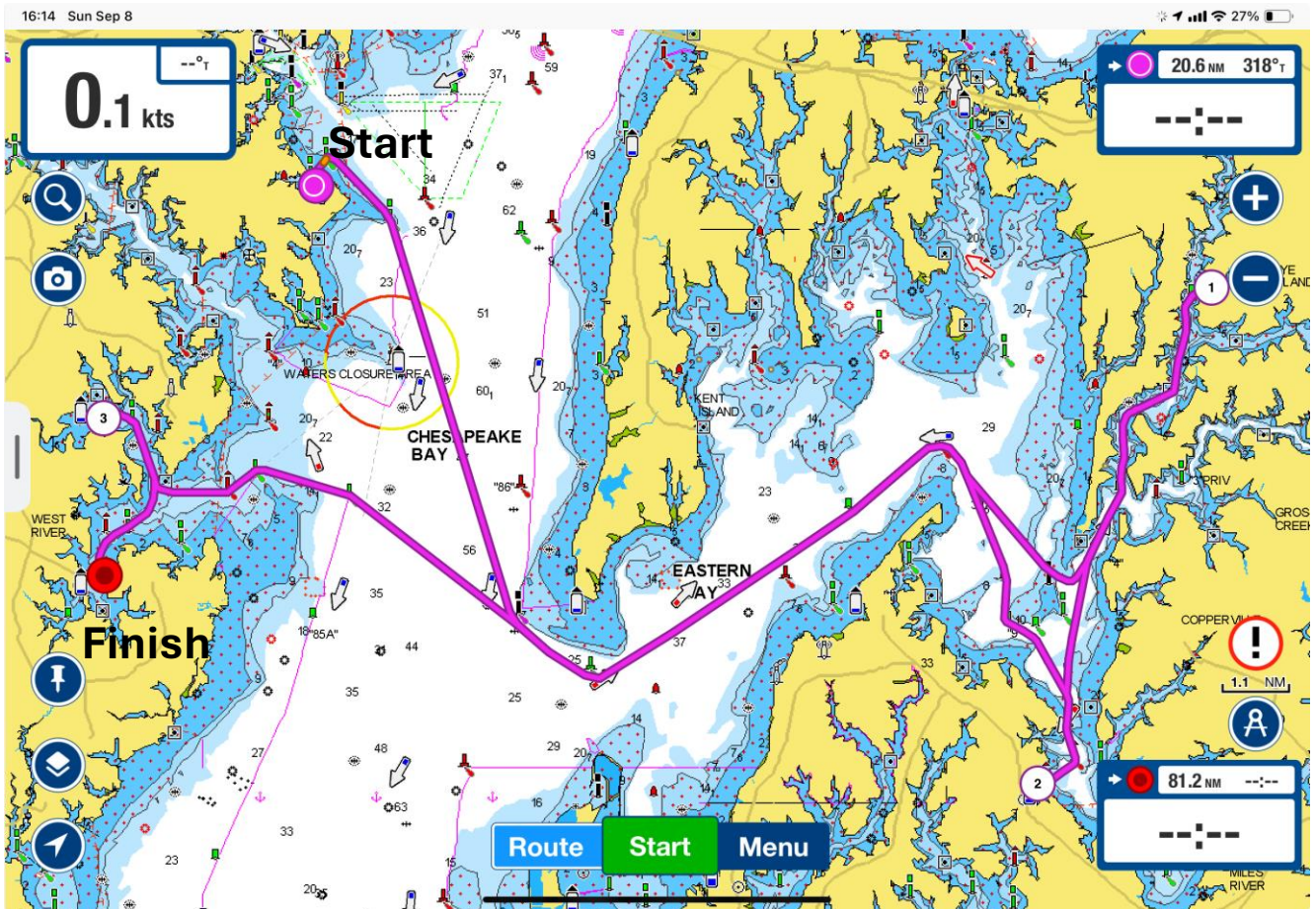

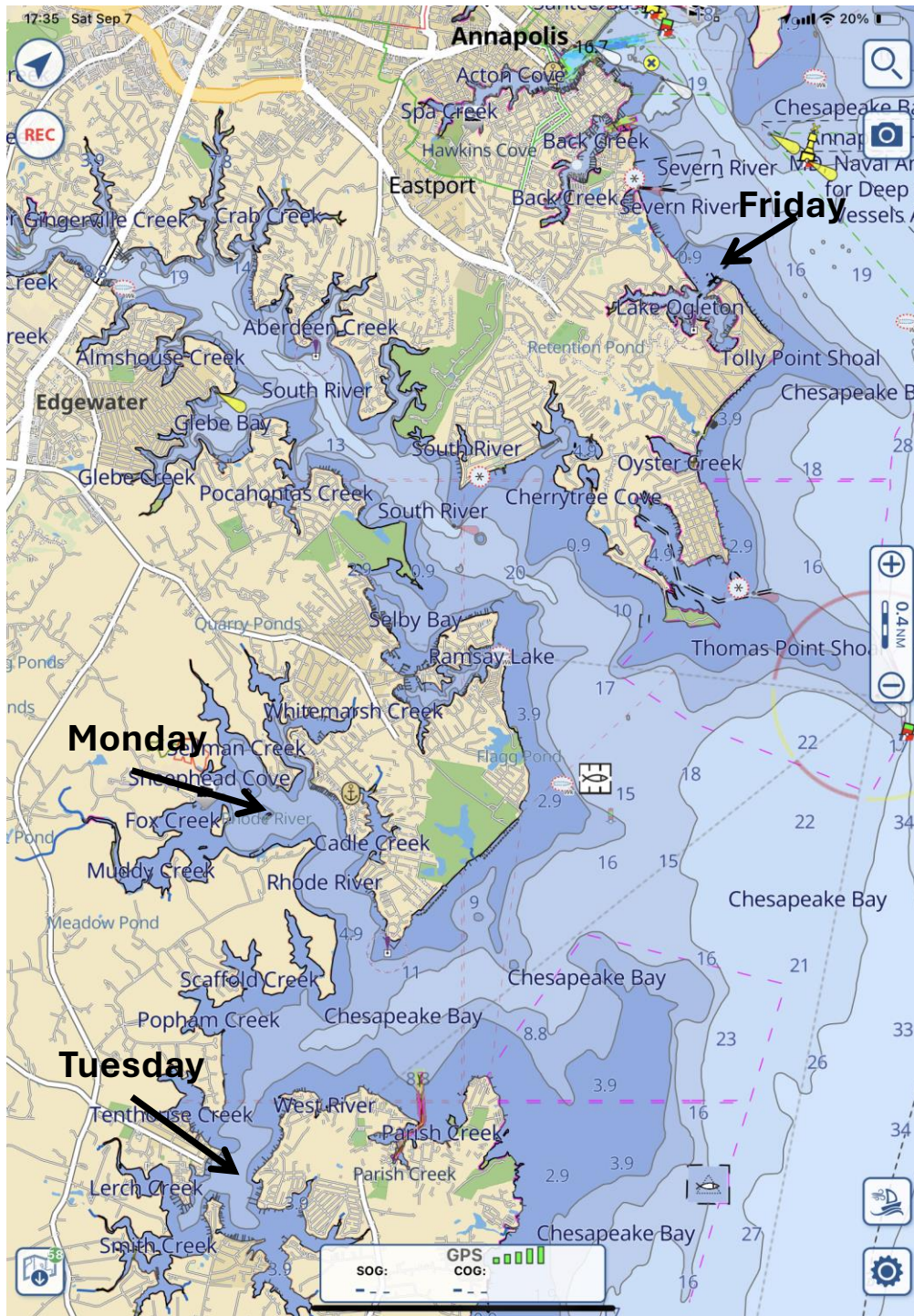

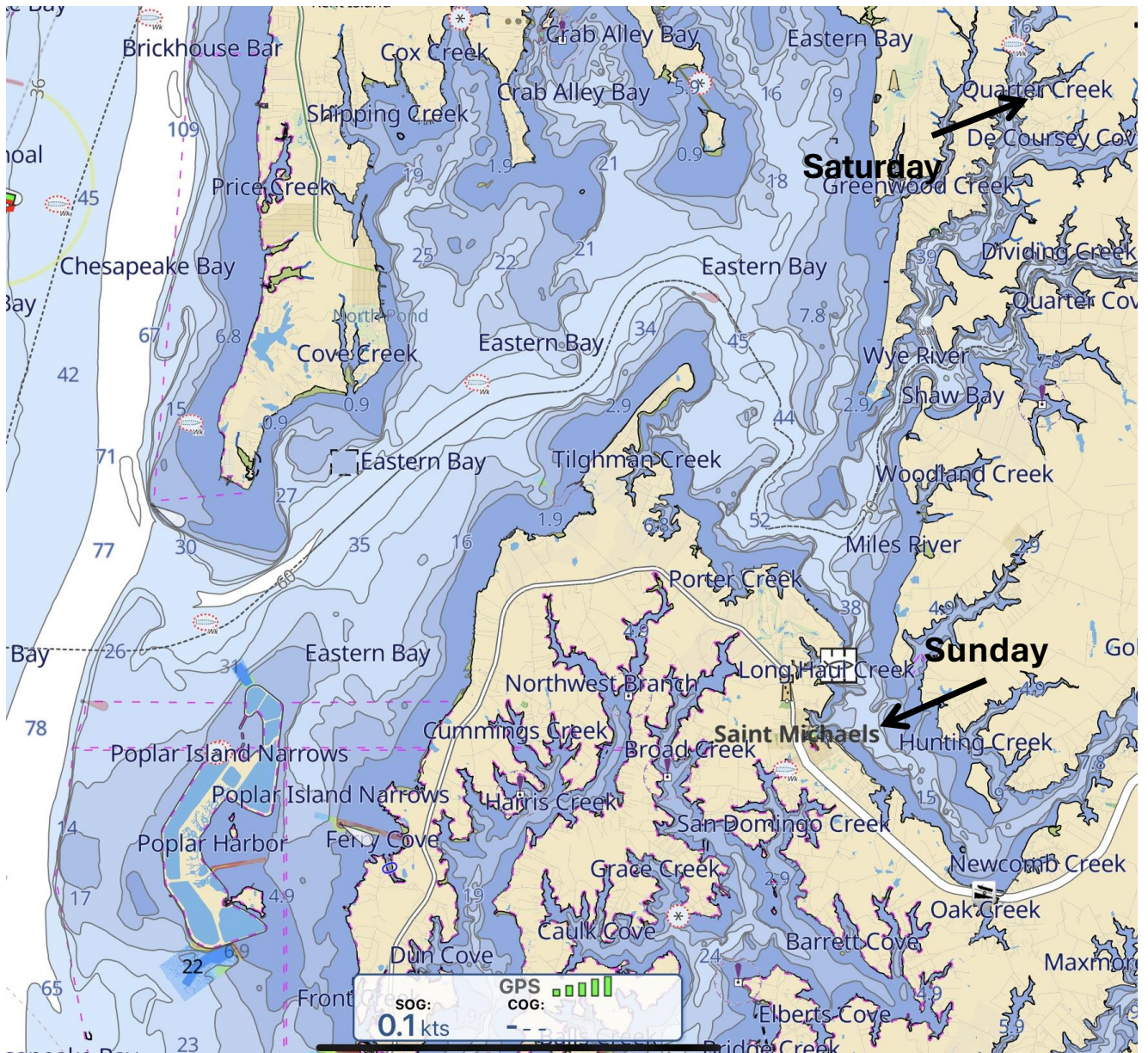

Please wear your CCA Name Tag to each event on the cruise!

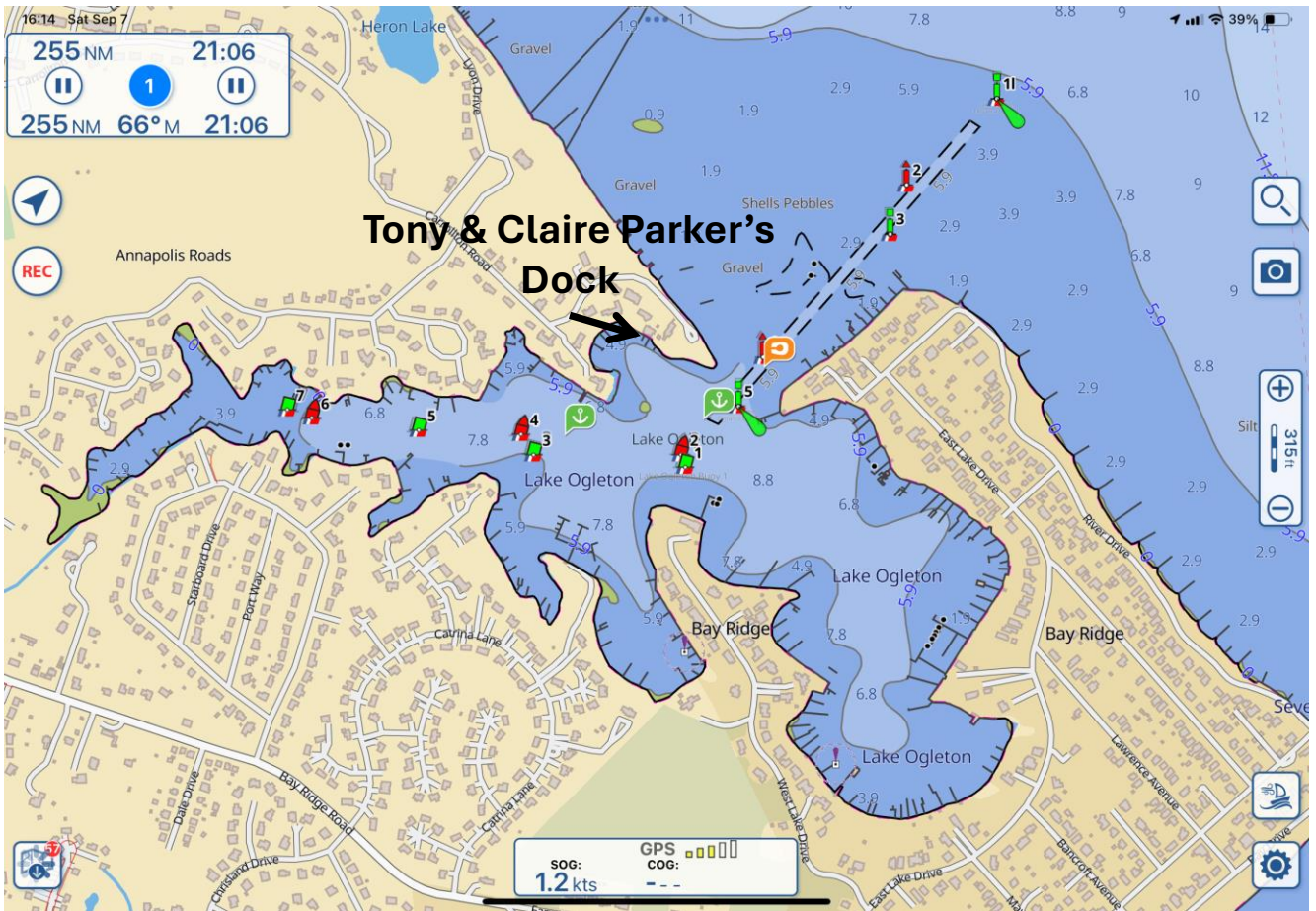
The cruise committee will broadcast morning announcements daily at 0800 (after morning colors) on VHF 78A.

CCA members should fly a CCA burgee in its proper position as described on page 422 in the 2024 CCA Yearbook.

It is requested that skippers make evening colors prior to heading ashore if they will not be back aboard at sunset for evening colors.

There are two destinations where participants are requested to bring an hors d’oeuvre to share. Each boat will be responsible for only one of those evenings. Boats with names beginning A through H are requested to provide such on Saturday at Quarter Creek. Boats with names between I and Z are requested to provide such on Monday in Rhode River

Time: 1700-2000 hours

Location: ~38°56.9'N/076°27.9'W

Directions: **By sea:** At Lake Ogleton Entrance Light "1L" (~1.4 NM SSE of Horn Point, Annapolis Harbor) follow entrance channel to G"5". Parker home (with dinghy dock) is to starboard with CCA burgee displayed. Anchor in Lake Ogleton. **Do not pick up any of the many private moorings without permission of the owner!**

By land: 2507 Carrollton Rd, Annapolis, MD.

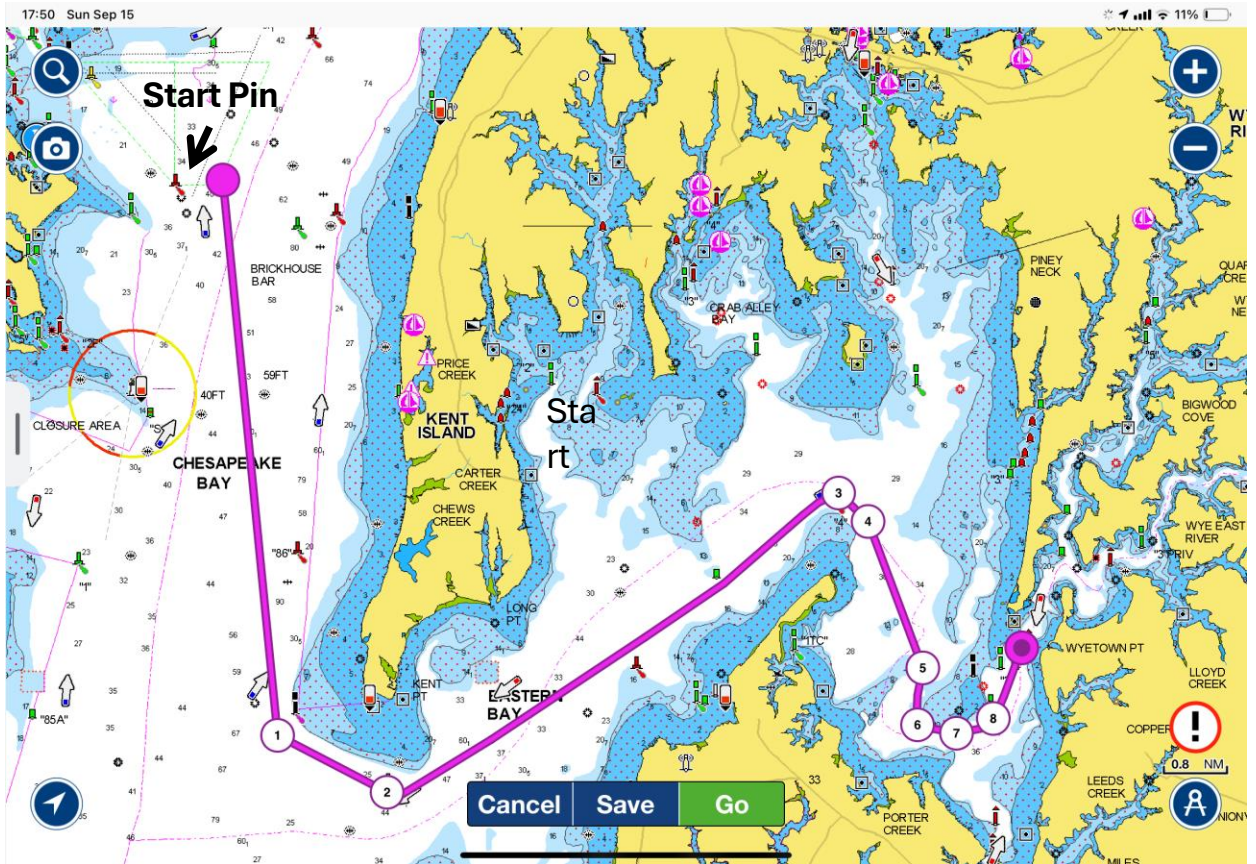
There **will be absolutely no on- or off-street parking available.**

At the Parker Residence, drop any passengers you may have, and a **covered golf cart shuttle** will lead you to our available parking area and shuttle you back to the house. Alternatively, you may find it more convenient to Uber or taxi from Annapolis.

Skipper's Notes:

- Enter Lake Ogleton and anchor after clearing G"5", in 7-8' (mlw)
- Dinghy to Parker home (~0.12 nm NW of G"5") at 1700 and tie to dinghy dock shoreward of buy boats *Coastal Queen* and *Nellie Crockett* (flying a large CCA burgee) at head of pier
- Rum Keg will be on the deck before entering the house, full bar inside. Enjoy!
- Sunset: 1822 hours (Full moon)

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS
2024 FALL CRUISE RACE
For the Sunny Neff Trophy
Saturday, October 19, 2024**

GENERAL: Racing will be governed by the 2021-2024 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) as adopted by US Sailing and by these Sailing Instructions.

PHRF ratings will be used. The Race Committee will assign ratings to unrated yachts. Decisions on any protest heard by the Race Committee will be final.

Cruising canvas only. No spinnakers or mizzen staysails. Spinnaker pole may be used to wing out the jib (genoa) on opposite side of main boom – jib (genoa) must be attached to headstay. Headsail changes must be bare headed.

Communications will be on channel **VHF 78A**. This channel should be monitored prior to the start and for the duration of the race for any starting time change, shortening of course, course change, and abandonment announcements.

START:	0955 Warning Signal	Numeral “1” up
	0956 Preparatory Signal	Flag: “P” up
	0959	“P” down
	1000 Start	“1” down

STARTING LINE: Between R”2” (approx. 1.2 nm E of Tolly Point) and a Yellow flag on the nearby Race Committee Boat. Note a drop mark may be used instead of the government mark if needed.

Sailing Instructions (con't)

COURSE: From the starting line, proceed South to:

Leaving to Port: Bloody Point Warning Light

Leaving to Port: G "1E", S of Kent Point

Leaving to Starboard: R "4", Eastern Bay

Leaving to Starboard: R "6", Eastern Bay

Leaving to Starboard: R "8", Eastern Bay

Leaving to Port: G "9", N of Hambleton Point

Leaving to Port: G "11", NE of Hambleton Point

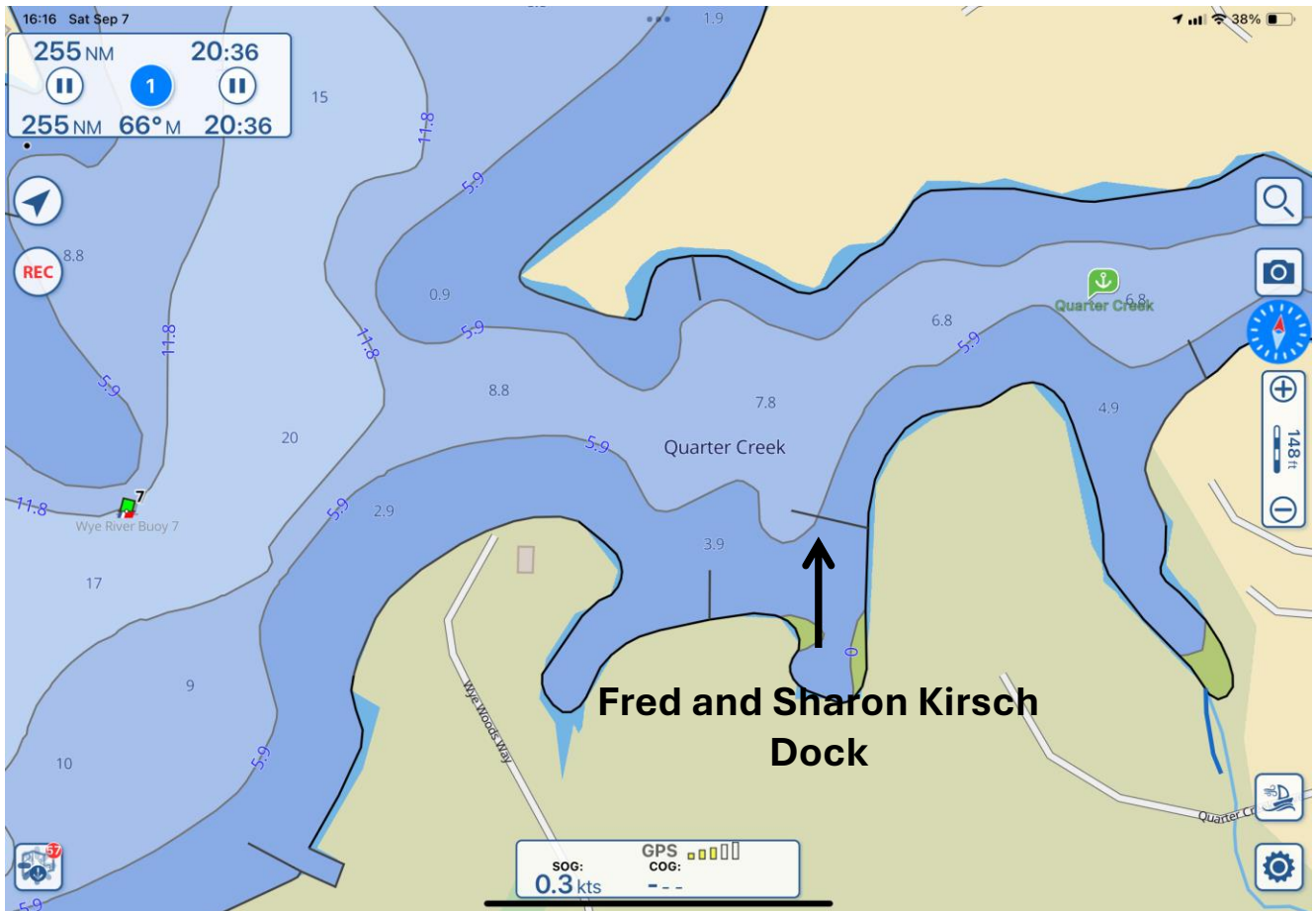
Leaving to Port: G "1W", ENE of Hambleton Point

To the **FINISH** leaving to Starboard R "4", W off Wyetown Point. If no RC boat is on station, take your finish time when R "4" bears 145 degrees magnetic at a distance of approx. 75 yards.

Total Course Length approx. 19.7 nm.

The course may be shortened to finish at any mark of the course at the race committee's discretion!

Quarter Creek – Rum Keg, Bar and Oysters. BYO Hors d'Oeuvres



Saturday, October 19: *Sunny Neff Trophy Race* to Eastern Bay (~19.7 NM).

Anchor in Quarter Creek, Wye River (~25.8 NM total) off the home of Fred & Sharon Kirsch (raft-ups encouraged). CCA Rum Keg, limited Bar, and oysters provided aboard *Nellie Crockett* (Ted & Mimi Parish's 1925 Chesapeake Buy Boat). Boats with names beginning A to H, please bring an hors d'oeuvre to share. Feel Free to BYOB.

Rum Keg, Bar and Oysters. BYO Hors d'Oeuvres (con't)

Time: 1630 hours

Location: ~33°55.1'N/076°9.6'W

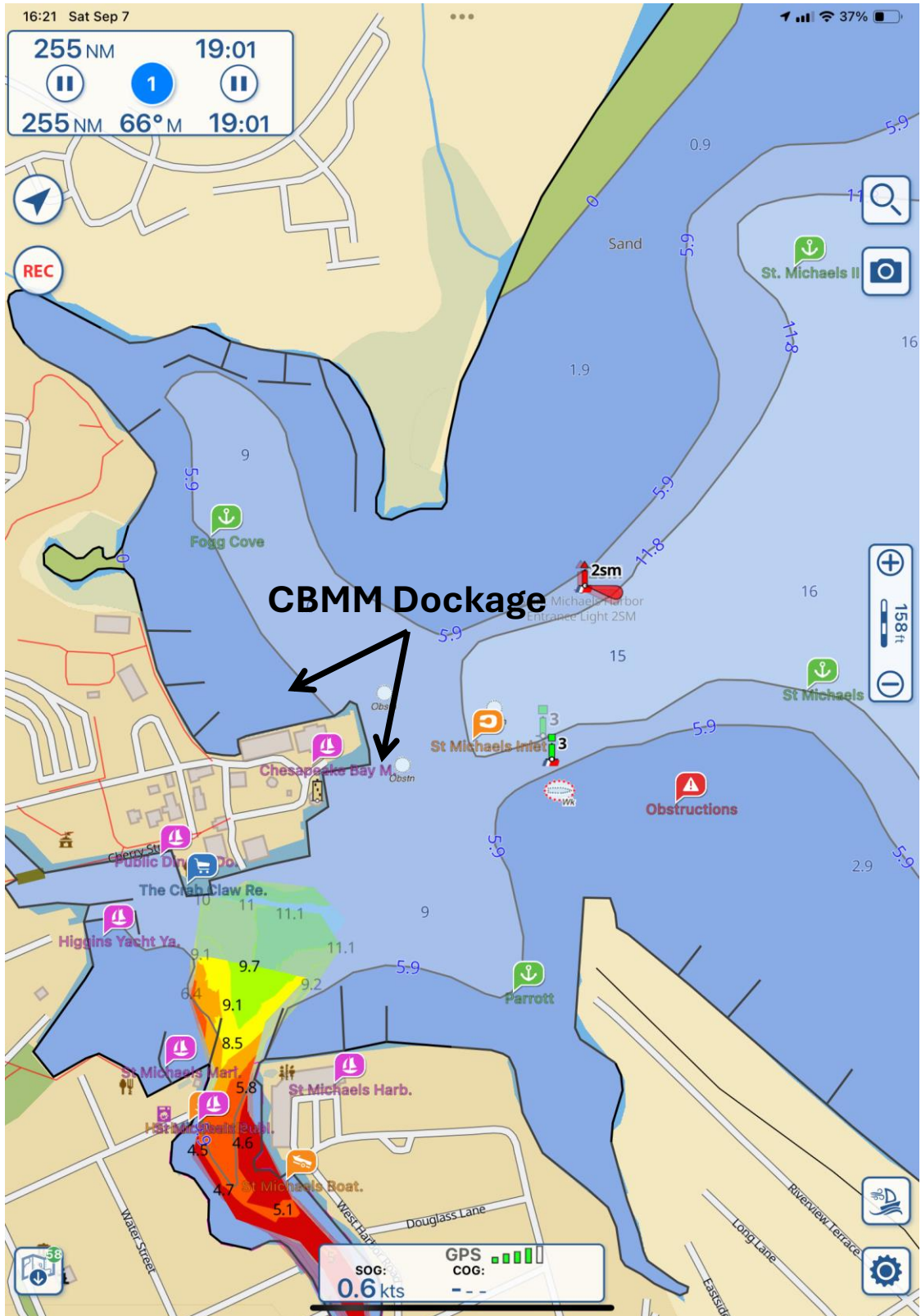
Directions: **By sea:** From Eastern Bay, pass Wye River Entrance Daybeacon G "3" south of Bennett Point and head north up the Wye River, turning ENE at GC"7" to enter Quarter Creek. There is plenty of anchoring space north of the Kirsch's dock, where you will see their 80' expedition motor yacht *iiwii*

By land: 422 Quarter Creek Drive, Queenstown, MD. Park in designated area once in driveway

Skippers' Notes:

- From Eastern Bay, head north to G"7", turning ENE into Quarter Creek per sailing directions. Anchorage is N and NW of *iiwii* in 6-8' (mlw). Deeper draft vessels may anchor out in Wye River, N or S of G"7"; rafting encouraged in the anchorage north of the Kirsch pier. There may be limited dockage (with rafting) on the pier; hail "Quarter Creek Port Captain", VHF 78A for availability and instructions.
- Dinghies may tie on either side of pier, closer to shore.
- Feel free to take a walk and explore ashore a bit.
- Rum Keg, limited CHE bar, and shucked oysters at 1630 hours aboard *Nellie Crockett* at end of pier. Feel free to BYOB. Boats with names beginning A to H, Please bring an hors d'oeuvre to share.
- Sunset: 1820 hours

Time: CBMM dockage (if you have reserved) will be available after 1030 hours.

Location: ~38°47.3”N/076°13.1’W

Directions: **By sea:** Proceed back south along the Wye River, leaving both G “3” and Wye River Entrance light G “1W” to starboard. Once past Miles River light R “4”, head SW toward St. Michaels Harbor entrance light R “2SM”. CBMM docks will be ahead on Navy Point. Call dockmaster on VHF 16 if you have made a reservation (or tel: 410-745-4946) for instructions.

By land: 213 N Talbot St, St Michaels, MD

Activities: 1300-1500 hours: Private docent tour (beginning at Welcome Center) of CBMM boat building/restoration projects; feel free to tour the remainder of the many CBMM exhibits on your own.

1630 hours: BYOB and/or CHE-provided wine, beer and snacks at the Hooper Strait Lighthouse on Navy Point

- Follow sailing directions south from Quarter Creek; call CBMM dockmaster (VHF 16) once in sight of Navy Point (boats with reservations) to receive docking instructions.
- Once your vessel is secured, stop by Dockmaster's office for CBMM campus maps and CBMM visitor "stickers" for your crew. (Download Boaters' Guide and see Marina Map in this Guide).
- Private docent tour (for pre-registered CCA members and guests) from 1300 to 1500 hours starting at the new "Welcome Center" building, north of the parking areas.
- Casual happy hour under the Hooper Strait Lighthouse, 1630-1830 hours. CHE Station will supply wine, beer, and some light snacks. Feel free to BYOB.

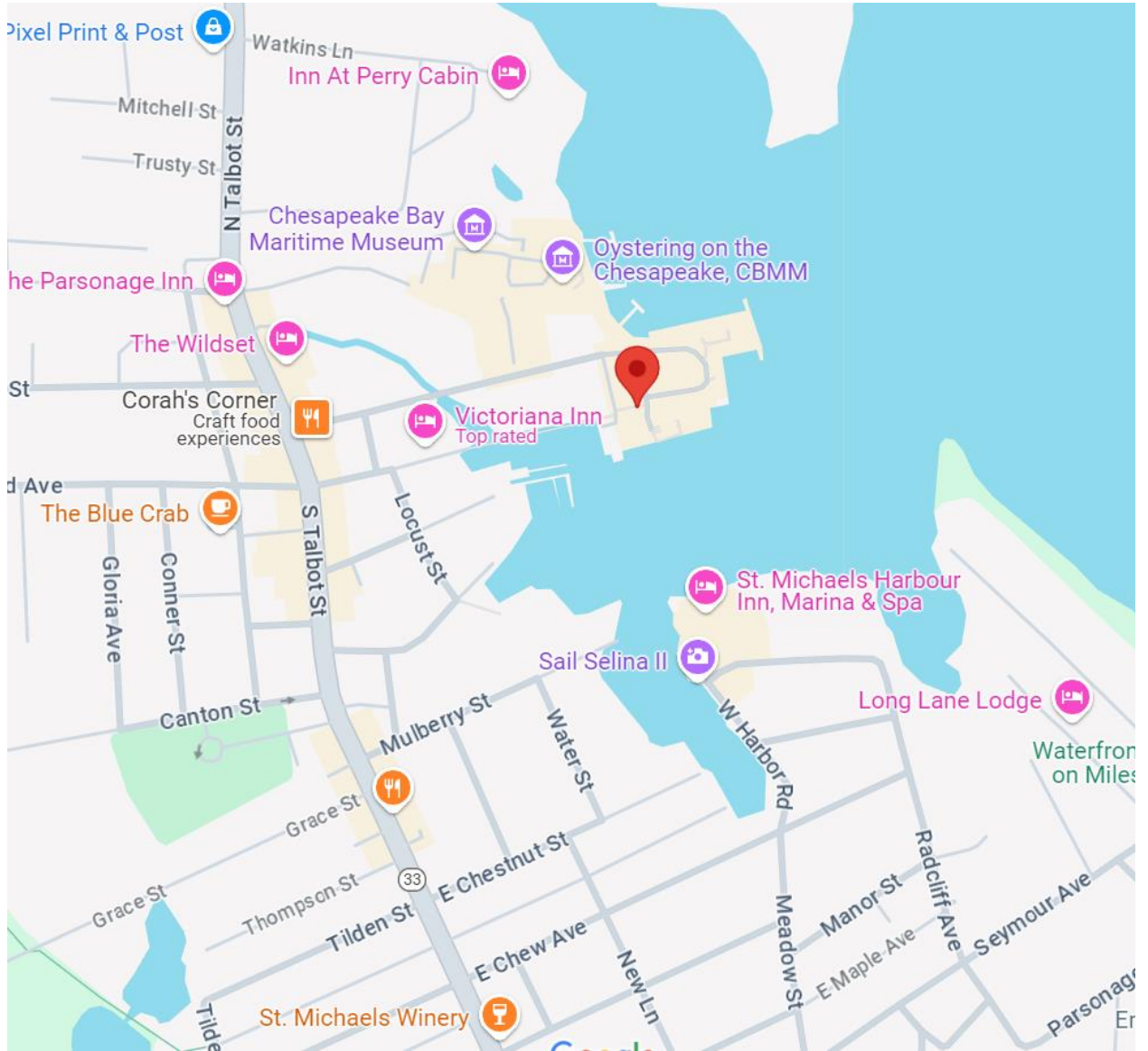

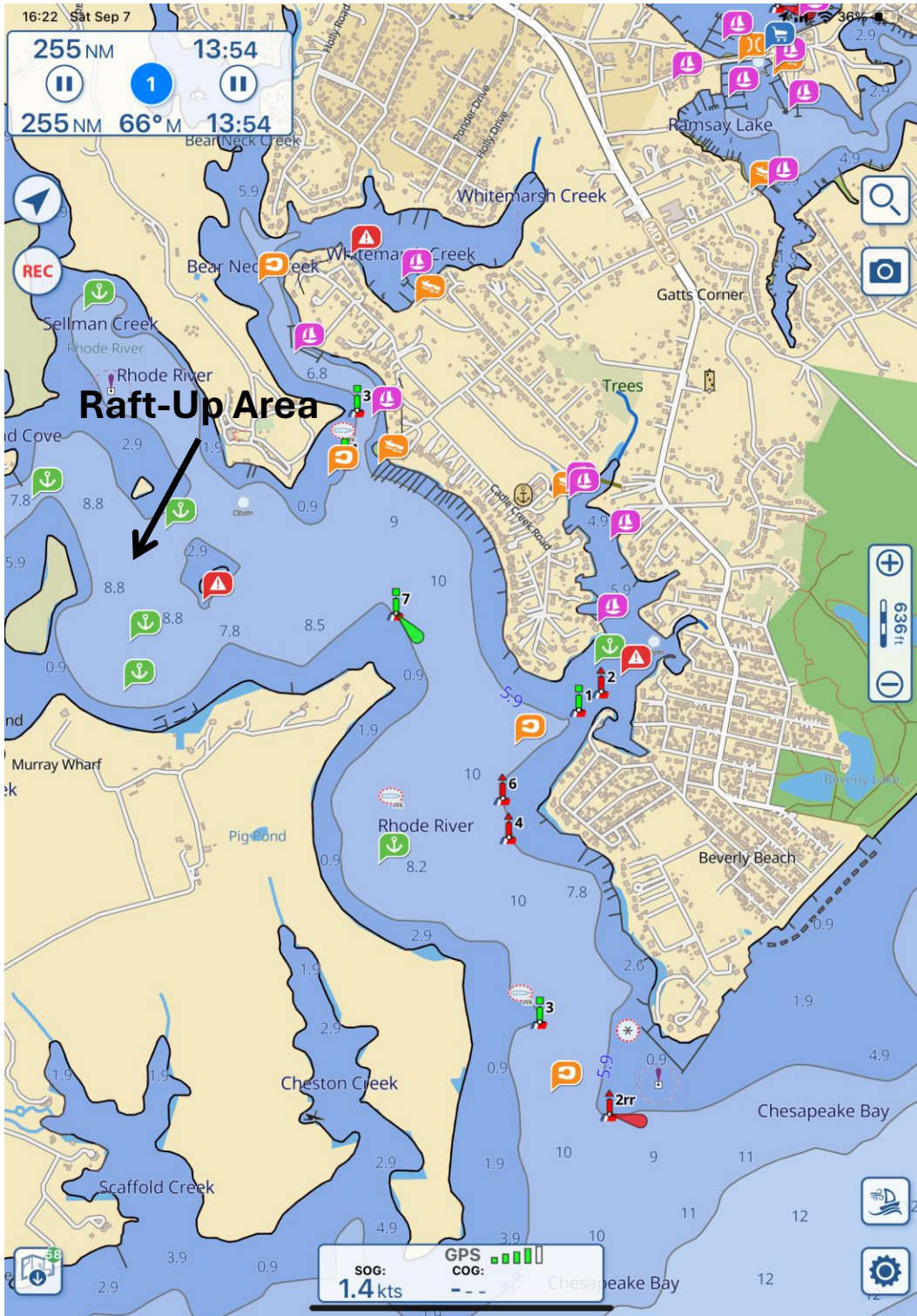

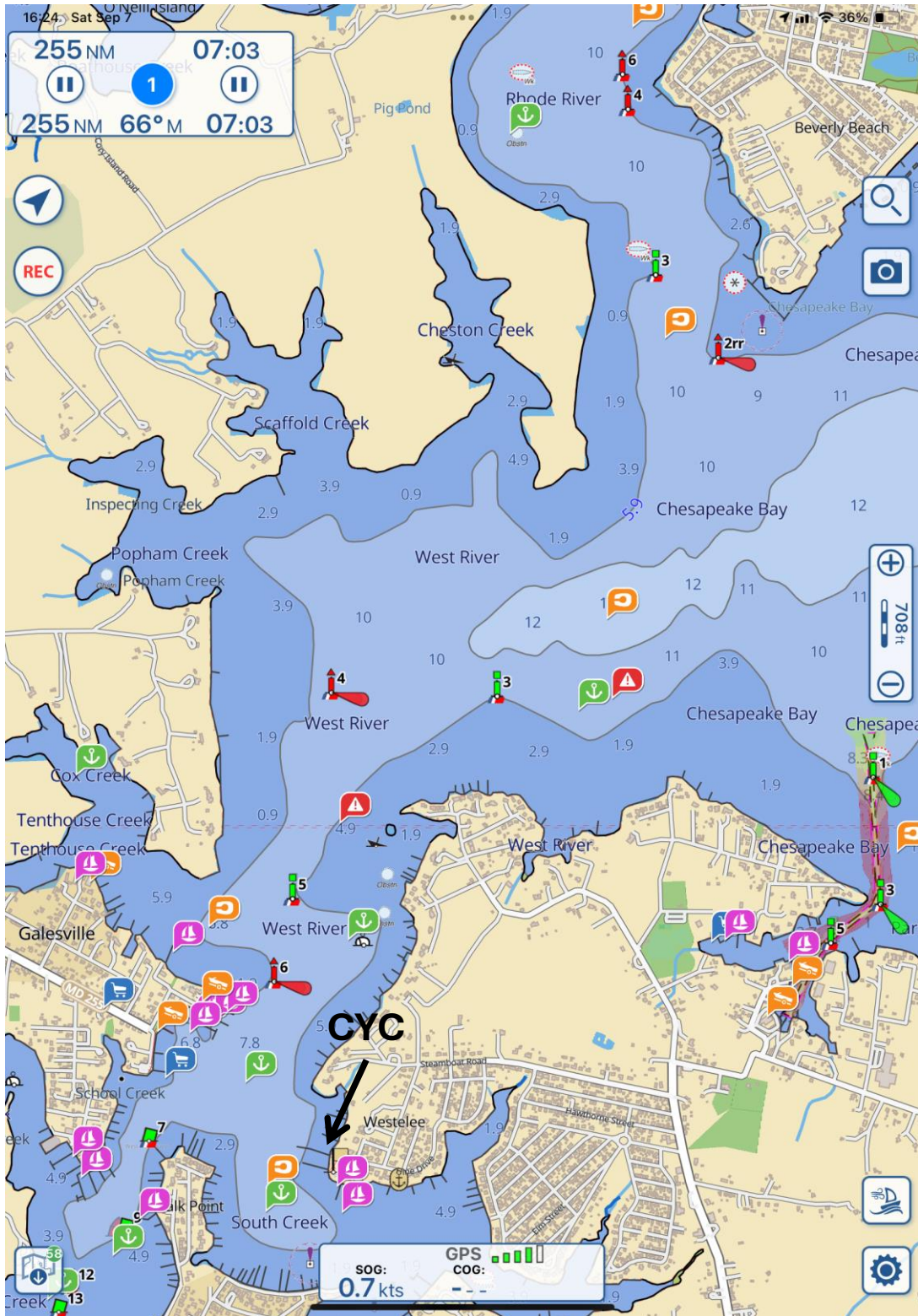
